Mental Health Workshop

AIDB, Mobile Regional Center and AL Dept. of Mental Health, Office of Deaf Services worked together to provide a FREE workshop to the Interpreters in Mobile on May 20th. We had 33 participants from Mobile, Daphne, Robertsdale, Mississippi and Florida. Brian McKenny presented on "Ethics in Interpreting Mental Health: Confidentiality". There was a mixture of educational interpreters, community interpreters. and church interpreters.

Brian taught us that the issue of confidentiality affects all aspects and areas of interpreting, not just mental health settings. One interpreter commented afterwards, "I didn't think this would even apply to me but thought I would come anyway. Boy, it was an eye opener! I learned so much!" Brian had a power point presentation and we

also broke out into groups for discussion on specific case scenarios and how we would apply the "Demand-Control" schema to each situation. AIDB provided refreshments and Office of Deaf Services provided the speaker and CEUs. We hope to have another speaker from Office of Deaf Services again and offer another great workshop to the


